DAHS GENERAL EXHIBITION RULES

1. Conditions of entry - The object of the Society in offering prizes for meat livestock is to promote improvements in the breeding of stock. Judges will be instructed to disqualify all animals exhibited as store stock if, in their opinion, such animals are over fed for breeding purposes. Where animals are adjudged to be of equal merit, preference will be given to purebred animals.
2. Ownership of animals - Every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
3. Forms of entry for the various classes will be found in the appropriate schedule. All entries must be completed & paid for by the closing date for the class. No extension of closing dates will be permitted. The fees and closing dates for the classes are found in the schedules.
4. Accuracy of Entries - Every Exhibitor shall be held responsible for the accuracy of his or her entry. If when called upon to prove its accuracy the exhibitor fails to do so, the entry may not be accepted, cancelled if already accepted, or the exhibit may be disqualified.
5. Entries from minors - Entries from persons under 18 years of age shall only be accepted where the entry has been countersigned by the exhibitor's parent, trustee or guardian, who shall be held responsible for the accuracy of the entry and for compliance with the regulations of the show. Any entry made in contravention of this rule and inadvertently accepted may be cancelled.
6. Judges interest in entries - Exhibitors are particularly requested to note the name of the judge appointed for all classes which they wish to enter and are advised in the interests of all concerned not to knowingly enter an animal which has been owned or bred by the judge. Where the judge has a continuing business or financial relationship with an exhibitor, he / she should not judge an animal entered by that exhibitor whether or not the animal concerned forms part of that business relationship. Where the judge has had a past financial or breeding interest in an animal, he / she should not judge it. In such cases the Ring Steward in conjunction with the Chief Steward will make arrangements for the exhibit to be finally placed by another judge.
7. Substitution of Judges - The Committee reserve the right in their absolute discretion to change the judge for any classes from the one previously announced.
8. Entries not accepted - The Society may in their absolute discretion refuse to accept any entry. The entry will be returned along with any fee and no correspondence will be entered into with regard to the non-acceptance.
9. Number of entries - Any number of entries may be made, unless otherwise stated in the class schedule, in each class upon the payment of the appropriate fee.
10. Nomination of exhibits - The name of the Exhibit (except in the case of commercial sheep and cattle) together with its sex must be stated on the certificate of entry. In Horse classes it must be stated whether the exhibit is a colt, gelding, filly, mare or stallion. Substitutions are not permitted in any of the classes except in the show jumping section. In other classes only the nominated animal will be permitted to parade for judging.
11. Age of exhibits - Pedigree Cattle and Goat Classes, date of birth of each animal must be stated on entry. Horse and sheep, the year of birth must be stated in the entry. There are no restrictions as to date of birth or date of purchase of horses competing in the show jumping classes. Exhibitors are advised to check in the class schedule for particular age requirements relating to the class in which they are exhibiting.
12. Identification of exhibits - Exhibits shall only be identified by the Show number corresponding to the list in the Entry Book kept by the Secretary and by no other means. This does not apply to owner's security markings or ear tags.
13. Cancellation of Classes - In the event of there being insufficient entries the Society reserves the right in its absolute discretion to amalgamate or cancel classes. If a class is cancelled the entry fees will be returned. Exhibitors will be informed before the show if this is being done.
14. Withholding Prizes - A judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his / her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.

15. Number of Prizes - Animals competing in more than one class shall be eligible to take more than one prize.
16. Exhibitors Risk and Responsibility - Neither the SOCIETY, NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANY WAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or to any exhibit or to any vehicle carrying any exhibit or anything else brought into the Showground or for anything else arising out of the Society's Show. EACH EXHIBITOR shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss or injury or damage done to or commissioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him or her and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. All exhibitors MUST have minimum Public Liability Insurance cover of £1 million in place. A copy of your Public Liability Insurance Certificate MUST accompany your entry form.
17. Trophies and Prize Money - Trophies can be collected from the Trophy Secretary after the Grand Parade. For Light Horse classes. Prize money will be paid on the day of the show only. Prize cards will be awarded in the class and exhibitors are requested to go to the Light Horse Secretary's tent after 11am on the day of the show. Any prize money not collected will be deemed a donation to the show and will not be paid out. Exhibitors are responsible for the safekeeping, whilst in their possession, and return of the trophies before the show.
18. Parade of Exhibits - All first, second, third and trophy winners in the various Livestock Section (with the exception of goats) MUST parade in the Grand Parade. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of prize money. Sheep Champions will be expected to parade - trailers will be provided to transport Sheep Champions to the Main Ring. THIS IS NOT APPLICABLE TO LIGHT HORSES.
19. Time for Delivery of Exhibits - Unless the class schedule states otherwise, all exhibits must be on the showground by 8.30am on the show day or one hour before the stated judging time (excluding light horses). In the case of unavoidable delay judges have discretion to permit admission. Any infringement of this rule may result in the disqualification of the exhibit.
20. Removal of Exhibits - Livestock (other than light horses) may not be removed from the Showground until after the Grand Parade. Other exhibits may not be removed until 5.00pm on the day of the Show or in the case of ongoing classes before the close of the day's events.
21. Protests - Any exhibitor wishing to lodge a protest against any other exhibitor must do so at the Secretary's Office not later than 5.00pm on the day of the show, or in the case of on-going classes, not later than the close of the day's events, on the day upon which the class is being judged. The protester must lodge a fee of £20 for each protest, which shall be forfeit if the protest is found to have been frivolous or vexatious by the Council of the Society. Members of the Council having an interest in a protest shall not be present when that protest is considered by the Council.
22. Disputes - Any dispute as to the interpretation of these rules, or with regard to the determination of any matter arising out of their infringement or any protest lodged by an exhibitor at the show shall be referred to the Council of the Society for settlement whose decision shall be final and binding.
23. Health and Safety Regulations at Agricultural Shows - In accordance with H&S Regulations all livestock exhibitors / stock attendants and all horse exhibitors and competitors must comply with the above.
24. All Animals must be Restrained - By halter, tether, leash or other means except as required at the time of judging. In the Livestock Section every animal must have secure headgear at the time of judging and all animals must be double tied to the cattle lines.
25. Conduct of Exhibitors and their Servants - Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of their servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of any servants or agents.
26. The Judge's Decision shall be final.
27. Litter - It is the responsibility of Exhibitors to remove all litter accruing in their display area. Failure to do so will result in the cost incurred being recoverable from the Exhibitor.
28. Sale of Food and Drink - Is strictly prohibited unless prior authorization has been granted in writing by the General Secretary.

29. Variation in Rules - Where there is variation between the rules of the Society and those of other events, breed societies and other associated bodies, then the rules of the Derbyshire Agricultural & Horticultural Society shall take precedence and in all cases the decision of the Council of the Society shall be final.
30. Data Protection - Exhibitors names and addresses will be published in show publications unless the Society is specifically instructed otherwise.
31. Refunds - Under no circumstances will Entry fees be refunded in the case of cancellation of entries by an Exhibitor.
32. Cancellation Policy - The Society reserves the right to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Where such a decision arises from directives, happenings or circumstances outside the control of the Society, the Society will refund fees, once any administration fees have been deducted. The Society will not be under any liability for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect, consequential or otherwise) arising from or caused by a cancellation, abandonment or curtailment.
33. Veterinary Cover: A member of the Scarsdale Veterinary Group will be available on site throughout the Show. The Vet/s will be situated in a marquee next to the General Secretary's Marquee which is adjacent to the Members Marquee.

All prize money will be paid out on the day of the show any time **after 11.00am** from the Light Horse Secretary's Tent. Competitors must produce their signed prize voucher before the money can be paid out. No prize money will be handed over without the correct prize voucher.

Any prize money NOT collected at the show will be deemed to be a donation to the Show.

Light Horse Rules

1. The submission of any entries via the online system or by post signifies acceptance of all Derbyshire County Show rules and conditions.
2. All entries must be accompanied by the full payment.
3. Any payment that must be re-presented to the bank for whatever reason will be subjected to a £25.00 administration fee for each occasion.
4. No entries will be accepted on the day of the show.
5. Derbyshire County Show reserve the right to cancel any class or section without being required to assign reason or being liable for any compensation. In these circumstances' entry fees will be refunded.
6. Derbyshire County Show reserve the right to amend / amalgamate or split classes and or sections if they deem fit.
7. No entry fees will be refunded after the closing date except on production of a relevant doctors / veterinary certificate.
8. Entries for affiliated classes or qualifiers will also be bound by the Rules and Conditions in force at the time of showing applicable to that Association and the class in which they are exhibiting. It is deemed by Derbyshire County Show that Competitors / Exhibitors are conversant with any such rules, conditions or directives.
9. It is the responsibility of Competitors / Exhibitors to ensure all property and livestock on the Showground for which he / she is responsible has the appropriate insurance including public liability. insurance – Your animal is your responsibility. No insurance, no admittance to the show.
10. There are Horse walks in operation, no trotting or cantering is allowed. All horses and ponies, ridden and in hand MUST keep within these designated routes. Competitors / Exhibitors, grooms and other associated persons must comply with any instructions from Officials, Stewards and signage around the Showground.
11. All Competitors / Exhibitors are expected to comply with Horse Passport legislation and bring the appropriate documentation with them to the Show and to be responsible for the documentation at all times. Spot checks may be carried out.
12. All Competitors / Exhibitors are required to ensure that all animals that enter the showground are fit and well. If anyone has reason to believe that an animal is unfit, please report this to a show official.
13. Equine Influenza - All horses and ponies MUST have completed a course of Equine Influenza vaccinations with a licensed vaccine prior to entering the Showground. Competitors / Exhibitors must ensure that the horse (or pony) has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. As a minimum these two injections must have been given before a horse / pony can attend the show. In addition, if sufficient time has elapsed a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently an annual booster injection must be given at intervals of not more than 365 days. A valid vaccination history and certificate of vaccination must be available for inspection on request. Spot checks may be undertaken on the Showground.
14. Warming up areas and designated exercise areas are provided, Competitors / Exhibitors must ensure that these are used appropriately. Warming up / exercising outside of these areas is strictly prohibited.
15. Competitor / Exhibitor numbers must be worn / clearly displayed at all times whilst mounted. Competitors / Exhibitors must enter the ring wearing / displaying the correct rider / handler / Exhibit combination number. Horses / ponies must enter and leave the ring at a walk.
16. All ridden animals must be four years old and over, the age of the animal will be calculated at the 1st of January in the year of its birth.
17. It is expected that all Competitors / Exhibitors enter their horse / pony for the appropriate classes, this includes height restricted classes.

18. It is the responsibility of the Competitor / Exhibitor to present themselves on time for their class at the entrance to the ring.
19. Derbyshire County Show will do all it can to facilitate the smooth running of classes enabling Competitors / Exhibitors to compete in all their entered classes. However, classes may clash, if this occurs Competitors / Exhibitors must nominate in which class they wish to compete.
20. Derbyshire County Show reserve the right to substitute other Judges for those announced in the Schedule or Catalogue for any who may be unavoidably prevented from attending. All entries are accepted on this understanding and no refund of entry fees can be made where a substitute is necessary. Where possible, any amendments to the Schedule will be posted on the Facebook Page and website www.derbyshirecountyshow.org.uk
21. It is a requirement of the show that all Competitors / Exhibitors, under the age of 18 years old, MUST wear a correctly secured current British Standard (or above) Skull Cap / Riding Hat whilst mounted. All Competitors / Exhibitors, under the age of 14 years old, leading a Horse / Pony MUST wear a correctly secured current British Standard (or above) Skull Cap / Riding Hat. Derbyshire County Show strongly recommends that all other Competitors / Exhibitors wear a correctly secured current British Standard (or above) Skull Cap / Riding Hat whilst mounted. Anyone not following this recommendation do so at their own risk and Derbyshire County Show accept no liability.
22. Any horse / pony, which is not under the complete control of a competent rider / handler or in any way constitutes a danger, will be asked to leave the Showground.
23. Body Protectors may be worn and are recommended whilst competing in Working Hunter.
24. Stallions and Colts must be adequately bitted, handlers must be aged 14 years old or over, unless otherwise stated / an affiliated society regulation.
25. Foals must be at least 3 weeks old on the day of the show.
26. Any suitable bit is acceptable in all classes, unless otherwise stated / an affiliated society regulation.
27. Boots (including over-reach boots) are permissible in the Jumping phase of any Working Hunter competitions but they must be removed before the conformation phase. At no other time is a change of tack permitted.
28. Anyone found mistreating a pony or horse may be asked to leave the Showground and may be refused entry in future.
29. Show canes or whips to be no longer than 75cms / 30 inches, with the exception of side saddle classes.
30. Dogs must be kept on a short lead and under control at all times whilst on the showground. Please ensure you clean up after your dogs.
31. A fall of horse or rider while mounted in any class will result in disqualification and they MUST leave the ring dismounted. If an animal gets loose from its handler whilst in the ring it will also result in disqualification.
32. No Competitor / Exhibitor will be permitted to enter the class once the gate is closed and the horses / ponies have been asked to trot. Exhibits may not leave the ring without prior permission from the Judge.
33. Any Competitor / Exhibitor not complying with any of the rules of the Show can be disqualified.
34. Use of mobile phones in judging rings is prohibited.
35. Competitors / Exhibitors may not knowingly exhibit a horse / pony that has been bred, sold, leased, produced, broken, ridden or trained by the Judge and / or his / her immediate family or his / her employer or anyone with whom he / she resides.
36. Judges will not knowingly judge a horse / pony that has been bred, sold, leased, produced, broken, ridden or trained by them or their immediate family, employer or anyone with whom he / she resides.
37. Derbyshire County Show reserve the right to move classes between rings if the need arises. Classes will not start before the time stated in the schedule. Any changes will be announced, and current information will be available in the secretary's tent.

WORKING HUNTER TRAINING STAKES

DERBYSHIRE COUNTY SHOW TRAINING STAKES - not before 8.00am

Judge Performance & Conformation

Competitors will be required to jump a course of fences and then give a short individual show including a change of rein & gallop. Marks will be awarded Jumping 60 points, Style & Manners while jumping 20 points, Individual Show & Manners 20 points. Any suitable tack & mane & tail plaiting optional. NO Spurs.

1. **DERBYSHIRE COUNTY SHOW 55cms Training Stakes.** - Horse / pony any height. 4 years old and over. Rider any age. Maximum height of fences 55cms.
2. **DERBYSHIRE COUNTY SHOW 65cms Training Stakes.** - Horse / pony any height. 4 years old and over. Rider any age. Maximum height of fences 65cms.
3. **DERBYSHIRE COUNTY SHOW 75cms Training Stakes.** - Horse / pony any height. 4 years old and over. Rider any age. Maximum height of fences 75cm.

WORKING HUNTER HORSES

WORKING HUNTER HORSES - not before 9.30am

Judge Performance & Conformation

Competitors do not need to be a member or registered with any society to enter these classes, but specific qualifying rules may apply, see below. Exhibits will not be ridden by the Judge.

4. **NOVICE WORKING HUNTER HORSE** - Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms, open to any breed / type. Horses not to have won more than a total £100 in any Working Hunter classes. Max height / spread of fences will be **75cms**. To be shown in any suitable bridle. All Horses invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
5. **WORKING SHOW HORSE** - Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over. Open to Hacks, Cobs and Riding Horses exceeding 148cms. Max height / spread of fences will be **80cms**. To be shown in any suitable bridle. All Horses invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
6. **WORKING COB / RIDING HORSE.** Mare or Gelding, 4 years or over, Exceeding 148cms Max height / spread of fences **80cms**. All Horses invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
7. **INTERMEDIATE WORKING HUNTER HORSE** - Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms, open to any breed / type. Max height / spread of fences will be **85cms**. All Horses invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
8. **OPEN WORKING HUNTER HORSE** - Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms open to any breed / type. Max height / spread of fences will be **95cms**. All Horses invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH1 - 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 4 - 8 are invited to compete.

WORKING HUNTER PONIES

WORKING HUNTER PONIES - not before 13.00pm

Judge: Performance & Conformation

Competitors do not need to be a member or registered with any society to enter these classes, but specific qualifying rules may apply, see below. Exhibits will not be ridden by the Judge.

9. **LEAD REIN WORKING HUNTER PONY** - Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Any breed / type. Mountain and Moorland breeds do not need to be plaited. Rider not to have attained their 9th birthday in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle. Lead rein must be attached to the noseband. Max height of fences will be **30cms**, shortened course of 7 fences. All Ponies invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
10. **CRADLE STAKES WORKING HUNTER PONY** - Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Any breed / type. Rider over 5yrs but to not have attained their 10th birthday by the 1st January the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle. Max height / spread of fences will be **45cms**. All Ponies invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
11. **NURSERY STAKES WORKING HUNTER PONY** - Mare and Gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 133cms. Any breed / type. Rider not to have attained their 12th birthday in the current year. Max height / spread of fences will be **55cms**. To be shown in any suitable bridle. All Ponies invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
12. **NOVICE WORKING HUNTER PONY** - Stallion, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cms. Any breed / type. Rider any age. Max height / spread of fences will be **65cms**. To be shown in any suitable bridle. All Ponies invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.
13. **OPEN WORKING HUNTER PONY** - Stallion, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cms. Any breed / type. Rider any age. Max height / spread of fences will be **80cms**. To be shown in any suitable bridle. All Ponies invited back into the ring following the jumping phase will be required to strip their saddles.

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH2 - 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 9 - 13 are invited to compete.

MAIN RING - 9.00AM START

LOCAL RIDER

LOCAL RIDER - 9.00am Prompt

Judge

Exhibitors must live or Horses / Ponies must be stabled within 20 miles of the showground as the crow flies. We expect that Exhibitors enter these classes in the spirit intended.

14. **LOCAL RIDER LEAD REIN 9 YEARS & UNDER** - age on 1st January in the current year. To be judged 50% on riding ability and 50% turnout.
15. **JUNIOR LOCAL RIDER 10 - 14 YEARS** - age on 1st January in the current year. To be judged 50% on riding ability and 50% turnout.
16. **SENIOR LOCAL RIDER 15 YEARS & OVER** - age on 1st January in the current year. Open to riders living within a 20-mile radius of the Showground. To be judged 50% on riding ability and 50% turnout.

Classes in the main ring can only run until 10.30am so if they over run Class 16 & the championship be held at 10.30 in Ring 3.

Each young handler should be accompanied in the ring by a parent or responsible adult with the sole purpose of overseeing & ensuring control.
18. **LOCAL JUNIOR HANDLER 10 - 14 YEARS** - age on 1st January in the current year. Mare or Gelding 4 years & over. Colts & stallions are not eligible in this class.
19. **LOCAL SENIOR HANDLER 15 YEARS & OVER** - age on 1st January in the current year. Mare or gelding any breed, any type.

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH4 - 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 17 - 19 are invited to compete.

These classes are affiliated to RoR. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored.

20. **TATTERSALLS ROR OPEN IN-HAND SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2024** - Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a Bit-less / In-Hand Bridle.

Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and / or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers / grooms must wear a safety / kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 24th 2024.

21. **TATTERSALLS ROR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2025** - Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The Series is open to AMATEURS only - those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers but will ride in the final. Competitors / handlers / grooms must wear a safety / kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. **The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2025.** Amateur definition:

Amateur definition - The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not / has not during the current season or previous season: - Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. - Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's / Trainer's yard from January 1st 2023 - Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional / Trainer in the current or previous season. - Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer / Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. - A rider who has ridden for a Professional / Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

22. **TATTERSALLS ROR OPEN RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2025** - Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2024. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. **The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead in June 2025.** All entries **MUST** be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have **RACED in GB**. All those entering horses and / or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force' Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. **Competitors must wear a safety / kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series.**

RoR rosettes 1st - 4th & an RoR branded prize to the winner to be redeemed from the RoR Office. The winner also qualifies for the **Tattersalls** RoR Open Showing Series Special at Aintree on Saturday 24th August 2024

Prizes - Veteran prize (15+) - £20 voucher to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Veteran Final at the RoR National Championships at Aintree

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH5 - 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 20 - 22 are invited to compete.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the relevant **Equifest Championship** class to be held at **Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 2nd - 5th August 2024**. Competitors **MUST** have their qualification record sheet signed by judge / steward / secretary; record sheets are available from www.equifest.org.uk.

25. **RIDDEN OPEN HUNTER** - Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, exceeding 148cms. Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.
26. **RIDDEN OPEN COB** - Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, exceeding 148cms.

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH6 - 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 23 - 26 are invited to compete.

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH7 - 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 27 - 30 are invited to compete.

The first placed horse in each class will qualify for the final at NPS Summer Championship show. Qualification may go no lower than third place. Foals are excluded from qualifying.

Competitors **MUST** have their qualification record sheet signed by judge / steward / secretary; record sheets are available from www.equifest.org.uk.

This Section is a qualifier for **The National Welsh Championship Show 2024 - National WPBR In-Hand Championship**. The Section Champion, Reserve & Youngstock Champion & Reserve (not already qualified) qualify to enter.

It is also a qualifier for **The National Welsh Championship Show 2024 - National Gelding In-Hand Championship** sponsored by Sarum Stud. All 1st & 2nd placed WPCS registered Section A, B, C, D & WPBR geldings in relevant classes (not already qualified) qualify to enter.

IRISH DRAUGHT / IRISH DRAUGHT SPORTS HORSES

IRISH DRAUGHT / IRISH DRAUGHT SPORTS HORSES - not before 11.30am

Judge

These classes are affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and only horses registered with or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership are eligible for entry.

All Pure-Bred Breeding and Youngstock In-Hand exhibits must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID(GB), AID or supplementary Grade up Register) and be by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID(GB) Stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register. A Graded MARE or FILLY is one that has been inspected or over stamped by the IDHS(GB) and passed into one of the following categories: ID Class 1, ID Class 2, RID, AID or the Supplementary Grade Up Register.

All 1-, 2- and 3-year-old COLTS must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler of 18 years of age or over.

All competing stallions must be inspected or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and classified as RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 OR Registered Irish Draught Sport Horse Stallion and must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails. All riders of stallions must be 18 years or over.

All ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over. Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the IDHS (GB) prior to the Show to confirm eligibility. The owners of all Pure-bred Irish Draught horses in both in- hand and ridden classes must be full members of the IDHS(GB). This rule does not apply to owners of Irish Draught Sport Horses.

Qualifiers

Class 31 is a Qualifier for The Moorbennhall Irish Draught Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed Pure Breds from each age group - yearlings, two year olds and three year olds - eligible for Class 1 on the Irish Draught Breed Register by an RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 sire out of a Graded dam or, if one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify to go forward to the Final which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 7th & 8th September 2024 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ. Each qualifier will receive a card. In the Final, there will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi-finalists from each class going forward to the Championship where the Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

Class 32 is a qualifier for The IDHS (GB) Sport Horse Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed Sport Horses from each age group that have not already qualified (must have a minimum of 25% proven ID breeding) - or if one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify to go forward to the final, which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 7th & 8th September 2024 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ. Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team. In the final, there will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi-finalists from each class going forward to the Championship where the Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

Class 33 is a qualifier for the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) that is registered or eligible for registration on the Irish Draught or Irish Draught Sport Horse Register, with a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding, will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Challenge. Horses need not be registered with the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) to qualify but must be on the IDHS (GB) Registers by the time of the Championship, which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 7th & 8th September 2024 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ.

In the final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money and a trophy. The Reserve Champion will be awarded £500, and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, and the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50.

31. **IN-HAND PURE BRED IRISH DRAUGHT YOUNGSTOCK** - Yearling, 2- & 3-year-old filly, colt or gelding (three-year-old colts must be uninspected), by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID (GB) sire out of a Graded dam.
32. **IN-HAND IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSE YOUNGSTOCK** - Yearling, 2- & 3-year-old filly, colt or gelding (three-year-old colts must be un-inspected), registered on the ID Sport Horse Register.
33. **RIDDEN IRISH DRAUGHT PURE BRED & IRISH DRAUGHT SPORTS HORSE** - Open to all horses with a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding. All pure-bred Irish Draught Stallions must be inspected and over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2, or RID (GB).

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH8 - 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 31 - 33 are invited to compete.

SIDE SADDLE

SIDE SADDLE - not before 13.00

Judge - MS V HOOD

Competitors do not need to be a member or registered with SSA to enter these classes, but specific qualification rules apply, please see below. Exhibits will not be ridden by the Judge.

These classes are run under SSA Rules as defined in the current Member's Handbook.

For all side saddle classes Juniors must wear hats to current Safety Standards. For adult riders it is strongly recommended that competitors wear a hat to current Safety Standard. However, adults choosing to wear silk hats in any side saddle classes do so entirely at their own risk.

34. **SIDE-SADDLE NOVICE EQUITATION** - Unaffiliated -Open to any adult or junior rider / horse combinations who have never competed in a Side Saddle Equitation Championship Class at any National Show. This class will involve a short simple show. No SSA points are awarded in this class.
35. **SIDE-SADDLE OPEN EQUITATION** - Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Members' Handbook Open to SSA Members and Non-Members.

Horses or ponies four years old or over. Confirmation and manners will be taken into consideration; horses will not be stripped. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed member aged under 14 years on 1 January of the current year.

A rosette sponsored in memory of The Late Mr R Philpot is offered to the Adult Member and Just So Elegant Side Saddle Hire sponsor a rosette for the Junior Member judged to be the best turned out.

36. **SIDE-SADDLE CONTEMPORARY** - Open to SSA Full, Junior and Non-members riding a Native, Non-Traditional and World Breed type horse / pony side saddle. Qualifying Combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show to be eligible to compete in the Final.

To be judged 25% Suitability of horse / pony for rider, 25% manners & way of going for type, 25% rider and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SSA, SHBGB or BSHA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; conformation will not be taken into consideration. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. The highest placed horse / rider combination

qualifies for the Final to be held at this year's National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. A special rosette kindly sponsored by Southernden Side Saddles and the qualification card will be given to the qualifying combination at each show, this may not always be the winner; if the winner has already qualified the card may be passed down to fourth place.

37. **SIDE-SADDLE RIDING CLUB HORSE** - Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over. Riders will be required to give a short show including a small jump, maximum 61cm (2'). The height may be adjusted during the course of the class at the Judge's discretion. The class shall be judged on the show, the manners of horse / pony and its suitability for the rider. Conformation will not be considered. A **Special rosette** will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards.
38. **SIDE-SADDLE BEST HORSE OR PONY** - Open to horses or ponies four years old or over. Confirmation and manners will be taken into consideration; horses will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card.

The Highest placed Coloured exhibit **ridden by a competitor 16 years or over** (who has not already qualified) receives a **Special Rosette** and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Owners / Riders need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider / Owner must be a showing member and their horse / pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final. Lead Rein competitors are eligible for this class. Leaders must be correctly dressed. Combinations qualifying after the current year's CHAPS Final may carry forward the qualification to the following year. All competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above (see Regulations).

39. **SIDE-SADDLE CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE** - Open to horses & ponies four years & over. The sole criterium is the elegance of the picture presented by horse / pony and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but a detailed inspection of rider or tack will not be required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards.
40. **SIDE-SADDLE CLASSICAL LADIES & CONTEMPORARY** - Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA or SSA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. **Judges must use the mark sheet provided.** The highest placed horse / rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. **Special rosettes** are offered by **Mrs T Mitchell & Mr L Mitchell** to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only.

The four highest placed Riding Horse, Hack (not ex 160cm), Cob or Hunter, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member qualify for the current year's **BSHA Championship Show Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship** and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place. Combinations qualifying after the current year's BSHA Championship Show may carry forward the qualification to the following year. **SSA Members** who qualify for **The Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship, will not be required to join the BSHA** in order to compete in any **Side Saddle class** at the **BSHA National Championship Show**. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed.

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH9 - 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 35 - 40 are invited to compete.

RING 3 - 8.30AM START

TRADITIONAL GYPSY COBS inc PART BRED (TGCA)

TRADITIONAL GYPSY COBS - not before 8.30am

TGCA - Affiliation Number 24 / 2306 / ULT.

Judge – KIM NEAL

To be run under TGCA rules. All classes are open to traditional gypsy cobs, which are of any colour and meet the TGCA breed standard. No known breeding is required to enter these classes.

Exhibitors do not need to be members of TGCA to compete and horses do not need to be TGCA registered (with the exception of stallions), but exhibitors are required to be TGCA members to qualify for the TGCA Quest for a Star Championship and the horse must be TGCA registered.

Stallions must be four years old and over, TGCA registered and have passed TGCA evaluations to enter. Stallions & Colts over the age of two years must be shown in a stallion bridle with metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook. Stallions must wear a TGCA stallion bridle disc.

TOYS Best of Breed Final - These classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the TGCA National Breed Championship Show 'TOYS'. In the Youngstock class the top three horses will qualify for the TOYS Best of Breed finals. In the Senior class the top three horses under 148cm and the top three horses 148cm and above will qualify for the TOYS Best of Breed finals.

Existing TGCA members who qualify must present their qualification card to the judge in the ring but must have already filled in the name and registration number of the cob.

Non-members who qualify will receive a qualification card in the ring and have 21 days to join and register with the TGCA to validate qualification.

TGCA Quest for a Star Championship (inc. Youngstock) - Exhibitors must be members of TGCA and horses registered with TGCA. The top three horses in both the Youngstock and Senior classes will go forward to the Championship (to be held after the Ridden classes). Only current TGCA members and horses / ponies that are registered with TGCA can exhibit in this Championship, if an exhibit already has their Quest for a Star qualification, then they should stand aside to allow members who have not qualified to participate. Membership card and Members Qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. Champion and Reserve will qualify for the Ultimate Star Championship at TOYS.

TGCA Part Breds Go for Glory Championship - PB -1st 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For 2023 TOYS qualifiers, the handler / rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members / registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

41. **TGCA YOUNGSTOCK IN-HAND** - Colt, filly or gelding. Yearling, 2- or 3-year-old. Any height.
42. **TGCA SENIOR IN-HAND** - Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Any height.
43. **TGCA RIDDEN (INC BUT NOT EXC. 148CMS)** - Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Any height.
44. **TGCA RIDDEN (EXC. 148CMS)** - Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Any height.

QUEST FOR A STAR QUALIFIER

1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners from the classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule.

ONLY current TGCA members and horse / pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

TGCA GREATEST GELDING AWARD

The award is aimed at encouraging the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level. This award will be presented to the highest placed registered Traditional Gelding.

CHAMPIONSHIP - CH10 - 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 41 - 44 are invited to compete.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the relevant **Equifest Championship** class to be held at **Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st - 4th August 2024**. Competitors **MUST** have their qualification record sheet signed by judge / steward / secretary record sheets are available from www.equifest.org.uk.

Part Bred Traditional Gypsy Cob Classes - Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is a traditional gypsy cob. Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

45. **TGCA PART BRED YOUNGSTOCK IN-HAND** - Colt, filly or gelding. Yearling, 2 or 3-year-old, open height.
46. **TGCA PART BRED SENIORS IN-HAND** - Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Any height.
47. **TGCA PART BRED RIDDEN (INCLUDING BUT NOT EXC. 148CMS)** - Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over.
